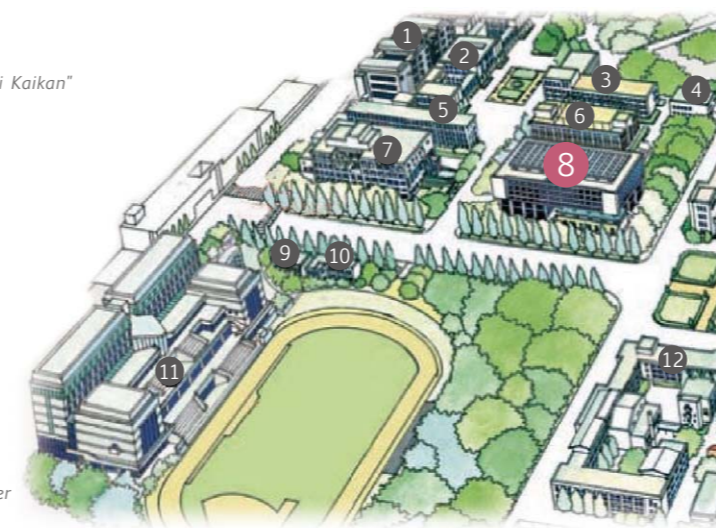
Hiyoshi Campus Map
